The project is based on the fact that five brothers from the Straub family were in the 18th century leading sculptors in several cities in present-day Germany, Austria, Slovenia and Croatia.



Project aims



The opus of the Straub family will be studied on international level along with comparison and analyses through interdisciplinary research with aim of confirming missing attributions and valorizing them accordingly



Transnational mobility of experts enabling the capacity building of participating institutions through the joint work and exchange of knowledge



The research focuses on the social, political and cultural foundations that brought about reshaping the barock and rococo style in a way specific for each of the studied communities



Recognition of the influence of heritage on the contemporary life of people and how it can improve their quality of life, focusing on both past and present and enhancing the value of cultural products



project utilizes a single team of experts consisting of researchers from the four countries instead of mere exchange of results of their particular locally focused researches.
